A CHANGED UNIVERSITY

- › Has recently undergone major reforms aimed at strengthening the university
- › From 55 departments to 27 spread over 4 faculties
 - › Arts
 - › Science and Technology
 - › Health
 - › School of Business and Social Sciences
- › My research center, Centre of Teaching Development and Digital Media, is organized under the Faculty of Arts.
- › Focus on the field of university and youth education, pedagogy and didactics, as well as within the development of study programmes and teaching activities in relation to university and youth education, the use of digital media to support learning, and the development of students' study skills, including support for students with special needs.

Aarhus – Denmark's youngest city

- › Aarhus is a city of growth and with a population of around 320,000, Aarhus is Denmark's second largest city.
- › It has all the advantages and resources of a big city while keeping to a manageable size, and consequently everything in Aarhus is within biking distance.
- › Aarhus is also Denmark's youngest city when you consider the average age of its inhabitants which is far lower than anywhere else in the country. At Aarhus University alone there are nearly 40,000 students. This gives the city a young and exciting vibrancy of its very own.
- › This is clearly evident along the canal in the city centre, where the student population today frequents the many cafés and restaurants packed tightly along the canal.
- › But Aarhus is also a city with clearly visible roots, founded by the Vikings in the 8th century.
